EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Global Election Observation Mission (GEOM) provided a comprehensive assessment of Rwanda presidential and parliamentary elections held on July 15 2024. These elections were notable as Rwanda first synchronized elections, aimed at enhancing democratic participation by simultaneously electing both the President and Parliamentarians.

PRE - ELECTION PHASE

Preparations: The Rwandan National Electoral Commission (NEC), led by Chairperson Rt.Hon. Oda Gasinzigwa, implemented meticulous planning and rigorous measures to ensure inclusivity and transparency. Extensive voter education and registration drives were conducted, and logistical arrangements were streamlined to facilitate smooth operations across all polling stations.

OBSERVER DEPLOYMENT

GEOM, along with other international observers, interacted with key electoral stakeholders to understand the preparations and provided feedback.

Observers from various regions, including the African Union (AU), COMESA, and the East African Community (EAC), etc were deployed across the country to monitor the electoral process and ensure adherence to democratic stand.

ELECTION DAY

Polling Stations: Observers reported that polling stations opened on time, and voting procedures were conducted efficiently. The presence of trained electoral personnel ensured orderly conduct, and the voting process was largely peaceful and transparent.

Voter Turnout: High voter turnout was observed, reflecting the electorate enthusiasm and commitment to participating in the democratic process. Special arrangements were made for diaspora voting and for special category representatives on different days.

POST-ELECTION PHASE

Counting and Results: The counting process was conducted transparently, with results being promptly posted at polling stations. Observers noted that the NEC ensured timely communication of preliminary results, which contributed to the credibility of the process.

Preliminary Findings: Initial observations indicated that the elections were conducted in a free, fair, and credible manner, adhering to both national legal frameworks and international standards. The synchronized election approach was **praised** for its efficiency and effectiveness in consolidating Rwanda's democratic processes.

RECOMMENDATIONS

GEOM provided several recommendations to further strengthen Rwanda.

- Continuous Voter Education: Enhancing voter education programs to maintain high levels of electoral participation and awareness.
- **Logistical Improvements**: Further refining logistical arrangements to ensure even smoother operations in future elections.
- International Collaboration: Encouraging continued collaboration with international observers to uphold transparency and accountability in the electoral process.

These efforts by Rwanda in organizing the synchronized elections and the contributions from international observers underscore the country's commitment to democratic governance and set a positive precedent for future elections in the region.

INTRODUCTION

GLOBAL ELECTION OBSERVATION MISSIONS-GEOM (Ambassadors Of Peace) is a Non-Partisan, Non-Governmental and Non-Political organization (*Ambassadors of Peace*). It came into operations in 2015 and our major aims and objectives is for Promoting Democracy, Fostering Peace in Africa and the entire world. These are enshrined in the Vision and Mission of our organization.

Our Vision

Aiming to foster global democracy, transparency, and fairness, our Global Election Observation Missions organization is dedicated to observing elections worldwide. We strive to ensure the integrity of electoral processes by promoting inclusivity, accountability, and the protection of fundamental human rights. Through collaborative efforts with diverse stakeholders, we seek to uphold the principles of free and fair elections, ultimately contributing to the advancement of democratic values on a global scale."

Our Mission

Empowering democracy on a global scale, our mission at the Global Election Observation Missions is to champion the integrity of electoral processes through vigilant observations. Committed to fostering transparency, fairness, and inclusivity, we work collaboratively with nations to ensure free and credible elections. Upholding the principles of accountability and respect for human rights, we strive to be a catalyst for positive change, promoting democratic values and strengthening the foundation of representative governance worldwide."

We also strictly follow our **Core Values** as an organization of being impartial in our work, transparency in reporting and non interference by trying to influence or instruct the election organizers plus election presiding officers.

This report presents an impartial assessment of the electoral process based on the historical background of Rwanda as a nation and the observations gathered during the pre-election, election day, and post-election phases.

Methodology

As observers of Global Election Observation Missions, we deployed a team of international observers who were well trained in the election observation principles and methodology. We chose to observe in Kigali city within its three districts of Gasabo, Nyarugenge and Kicukiro covering 176 polling stations. We used the Long-term observations method of the pre-election, election day and the post-election period where we managed to cover the final day campaigns of the three candidates of HE. Paul Kagame of FPR , Mr. Frank Habineza of Green party plus Mr.Mpayimana Philippe - Independent.

This report aims to provide a detailed assessment of the electoral environment based on observations conducted across various polling stations in Kigali City of Rwanda. The observations focused on key aspects such as organization, voter turnout, security measures, accessibility, compliance with electoral procedures, and public awareness campaigns or civic education . The findings presented here are derived from first hand observations made during the pre-current period, leading up to election day.

A structured approach was adopted to ensure comprehensive coverage of different polling stations and demographics within Kigali City. Polling stations were selected in the three districts to capture a diverse representation of the electorates.

The methodology involved discreet observation from a designated area within each polling station, adhering to local regulations and protocols regarding electoral observation. Data collection was systematic, focusing on specific criteria outlined to assess the electoral process effectively. Observations were supplemented by interviews with electoral officials, voters, and local observers to gain deeper insights into the electoral dynamics and challenges.

Legal Frame Work

As Observers we had to strictly adhere to the legal framework coined within the constitution of Rwanda **Organic Law No.001/2019.0L of 29/09/2019** and also to follow the international observers codes of conduct, Legal Framework and Oversight, operating within the national laws and regulations governing elections in Rwanda by avoiding conflicts with the oversight mechanisms which were put in place to monitor compliance and address any irregularities that may have arisen as per the rules and regulations of Rwanda Electoral Commission governing both local and international observers.

Pre - Election Period


Always the Pre- election period is punctuated with the civic education of the voters, voters registration, candidates registration then the campaign period. As observers of Global Election Observations Missions, we observed that the National Electoral Commission of Rwanda did its work of civic education and as a result ,the big turn up of the voters on the election day. It was an indicator that people were aware of what they were going to do on that day of electing their leaders right from the president ,the members of parliament plus the special interest groups of women and the youths.

About the total number of registered voters, Rwanda NEC registered 9,071,157 voters of which 4,225,740 (47%) were males, 4,845,417 (53%) were females. The Youth accounted for 42 % (3,767,187) of the total number of registered voters.

THE THREE ACCREDITED PRESIDENTAIL CANDIDATES



The Rwanda National Electoral Commission (NEC) completed the candidate screening process, successfully accrediting three candidates to run for the presidency of the Republic of Rwanda. The accredited candidates are Mr. Paul Kagame of the FRP, Dr. Frank Habineza of the Green Party, and Mr. Philippe Mpayimana, an Independent.

CANDIDATE PROFILES



Kagame is the current Head of State of Rwanda. Among notable deeds, he led the liberation struggle as the commander of the then Rwanda Patriotic Army (RPA) – army wing of RPF Inkotanyi – which is credited for defeating Juvenal Habyarimana's regime and stopping the Genocide against the Tutsi in 1994, and contributing to unity and peace restoration in a country that was devastated by the Genocide.



DR.HABINEZA FRANK

According to his profile on Parliament website, Habineza has an honorary Doctorate of Humanities (Democracy and Human Rights).

He was a Member of Parliament's Chamber of Deputies since 2018 **until June 14 when President Kagame dissolved the Lower House** for the 2024 election purposes.

Habineza is **attempting to be the Head of State** again, after his first bid failed in the 2017 presidential polls where he got 0.45 per cent of the total votes.



MR. PHILIPPE MPAYIMANA

Mpayimana is currently a Senior Expert in charge of Community Engagement at the Ministry of National Unity and Civic Engagement (MINUBUMWE), a position he has held since November 2021.

It is his second time to contest for the Head of State position after an unsuccessful attempt in 2017 when he got 0.72 per cent of the total votes in elections that the **incumbent**, **Kagame**, **won by a landslide**.

Before joining MINUBUMWE, Mpayimana worked in various media houses as a journalist since 1990.

Parliamentary candidates

A total number of 588 candidates were approved for the 2024 parliamentary elections and these are categorized as follows:-

- ✓ 345 (154 women and 191 men) candidates from political organizations and 1 independent candidate contesting for 53 seats.
- ✓ 199 female candidates contesting for 24 seats
- ✓ 31 (9 women and 22 men) candidates representing the youth contesting for 2 seats.
- ✓ 13 (3 women and 10 men) candidates representing people with disabilities contesting for one seat.

Briefing

We were invited by the National Electoral Commission Rwanda, to attend the briefing for all the Observers both local and international organisations and to receive an update on the status of the preparations by the Chairperson of NEC Rt.Hon. Oda Gasinzigwa at Gasabo Confrence Hall.

By the time observers left the Hall we had been equipped with all the necessary information about the elections in the republic of Rwanda to help us execute our work on the 15th July 2024. As observers we were briefed on what to do and what to refrain from when in the field observing elections. Emphasis was put on the respect for the Rwanda historical back ground and therefore that as we oberserve and write our reports we were cautioned not to interfere with the stability,democracy and peace that is prevailing in Rwanda. Here an **Organic Law No.001/2019.0L of 29/09/2019 governing elections in Rwanda** was quoted and a copy given to all observers. We were taken through the entire process right from registration of the voters, displaying of the voters registers, registration and screening of the candidates for presidential and parliamentary positions, schedules of the campaigns of all candidates and gazetting of the polling stations then the days of elections of presidential, parliamentary, youths and women.



The polling day and the polling stations setup;

As early as 5:30am on the 15th July 2024 all the observers of Global Election Observation Missions were awake and preparing ourselves for the voting as was scheduled to start at exactly 700am on all polling stations gazetted by National Electoral Commission of Rwanda - NEC.

We were at the polling stations by 7:am to observe the set up of the polling stations. The set up of polling stations plus the booths was to the point in that similar set up was in all the stations we managed to observe in Kigali plus the entire country. They were decorated with national colors and had music playing .These two were to enable voters easily identify the stations where ever they were located.

Voting Day

At exactly 7:00am voting started in most of the polling stations. We observed something unique at one of the stations where before starting one electoral officer made all the volunteers or presiding officers take an oath in front of the voters and a prayer was also said before starting. All stations were accessible by the disabled and the elderly.



Vote counting.



Vote counting started at all stations at the same 3:00pm because there was no weather disruptions


A presiding officer or poling station volunteer displaying a presidential ballot paper to the candidate agents and people around during the vote counting at one of the polling station.



Each polling station had one of the polling station volunteer capturing the announced candidate on a tallying sheet as shown above.

Vote counting started as soon as the elections closed by 3:00pm in all stations as was decided by the Rwanda National Electoral Commission. It was only those found in lines who were allowed to vote and as soon as all those found in lines voted then the counting also started. All that was required to capture the results were set and ready for the counting of the ballots.





HOW THE MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT PERFORMED





Chart showing how the MP's performed



HOW THE CANDIDATES PERFORMED PER REGION

Registered voters were: **9,071,157**. Total votes cast-were: **8,907,876**. Valid votes cast were: **8,901,453** representing **99.93%**. This is an indicator that NEC did a very good work of civic education and also that the Rwandans feel that pride of choosing their leaders with only less than 0.07%. This is possibly from those who are currently abroad.

Commendations

- We as observers of Global Election Observation Missions, observed that a commendable work was done by National Electoral Commission of Rwanda NEC of ensuring that elections in Rwanda was organized smoothly and all stake holders were handled with utmost respect and given equal opportunities to canvas for their support from the registered voters. Equal number of days were given to all the candidates for campaigning with no special treatment to one or some candidate/s. Because they all stopped campaigning on the same day of 13th July 2024 even the incumbent president Paul Kagame inclusive. So there was no discrimination of candidates.
- All the candidates were given security to ensure that no one is either hurt, intimidated or disorganized in their campaigns. So this is commendable and a job well done by the security forces of Rwanda as a government and by the National Electoral Commission of Rwanda.
- All the voters materials were delivered in time to their respective destinations, and polling stations were setup in time to avoid late preparations.
- The disabled, the elderly plus those who could not easily locate their polling stations were all helped by the station volunteers.
- The designing of the stations, the playing of the music at all the stations was highly commendable because it helped the voters to easily locate the stations and also it signified the importance of the day of the voters deciding their leaders.
- The volunteers were fast in handling the voters because the time taken to serve a voter was very short. So NEC Rwanda did a very good job of training the volunteers.
- As soon as the elections stopped per polling station, vote counting started and results announced to the candidate's agents and voters present. All the counting of the votes was done in a transparency way where each station had a tallying chart for every candidate.
- The National Electoral Commission did a very good job of online accreditation of observers. This made the accreditation of observers easy and fast whereby we just had to go pick the accreditation cards ready. So we appreciate the work done by the Documentation and archives department.

Recommendations

- There is need to have English speaking volunteers or presiding officers at all the polling stations to help the international observers understand what is taking place. This is so because most of the volunteers were speaking either Kinyarwanda or French and so there was that language barrier, hence the need for the interpreters to the only English speaking international observers.
- There is need to increase on the polling stations in the next elections because of the increase in population as more future voters will be joining the eligible voters data base. This can help reduce on the congestion and long lines with voters standing in either the scotching sunshine or rain.
- We highly recommend that the campaign time be increased to enable candidates traverse all areas of the country.
